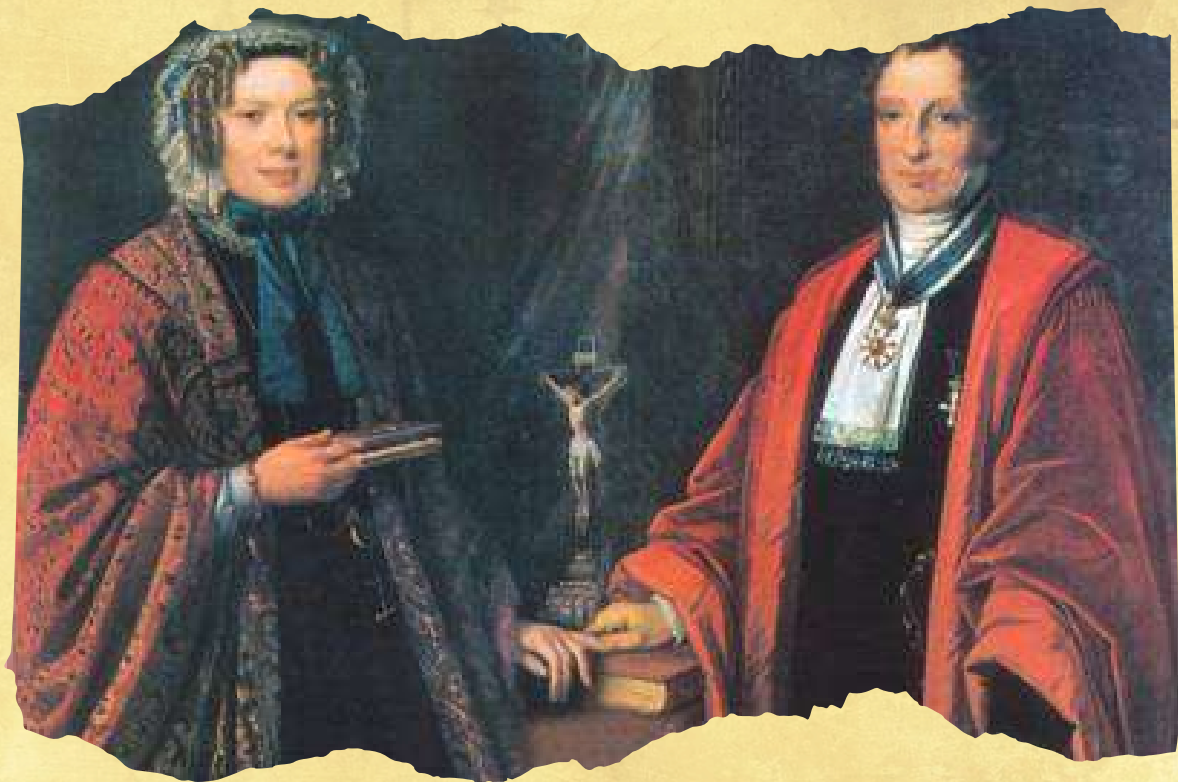

THE CONGREGATION OF THE SISTERS OF ST. ANN (SSA) WAS ESTABLISHED IN 1834 BY THE NOBLE COUPLE MARQUIS CARLO TANCREDI AND MARCHIONESS GUILIA DE BAROLO IN TURIN, ITALY. BELONGING TO THE ROYAL FAMILY OF PIEDMONT AND CHILDLESS THEMSELVES, THEY WERE DEEPLY COMMITTED TO SOCIAL REFORM AND THE WELFARE OF MARGINALIZED CHILDREN. DRIVEN BY A VISIONARY ZEAL, CARLO AND GUILIA SOUGHT TO BRING HOPE AND EDUCATION TO YOUNG CHILDREN WHO WERE OFTEN NEGLECTED AND VULNERABLE TO SOCIETAL ILLS. THEIR PRIMARY AIM WAS TO SAFEGUARD THESE CHILDREN FROM THE PERILS OF POVERTY AND MORAL CORRUPTION BY INSTILLING IN THEM A SENSE OF DIVINE LIGHT AND PURPOSE. BY FOUNDING THE CONGREGATION, THEY CREATED

A DEDICATED COMMUNITY OF SISTERS WHO WOULD CARRY FORWARD THEIR MISSION OF PROVIDING COMPREHENSIVE EDUCATION AND SPIRITUAL GUIDANCE. THE SISTERS OF ST. 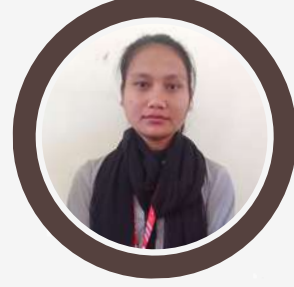

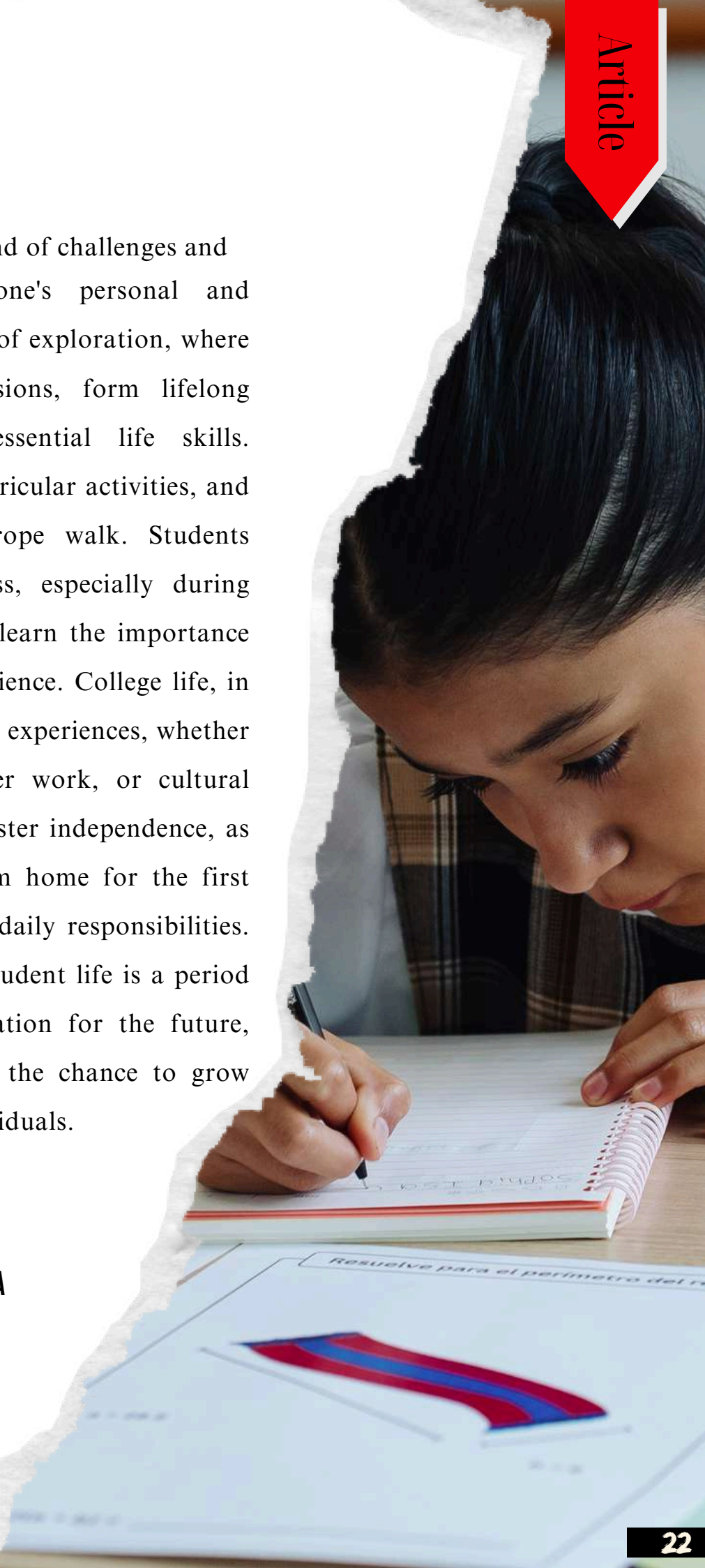

Koch Rajbongshi is an ancient tribe originally from the ancient Koch Kindom. The Rajbongshi tribe is referred to as Koch Rajbongshi, or Rajbanshi or Rajvanshi. The word 'Rajbongshi' literally means 'Royal Community'. It is considered as indigenous people of South Asia, at present they live in lower Nepal, Northern Bengal, North Bihar, Northern Bangladesh, the whole of Assam, parts of Meghalaya, and Bhutan. These modern geographical areas were once part of the Kamata kingdom ruled by the koches for many centuries. The communities is variously designated as OBC (Assam), SC (Bengal), ST (Meghalaya).

Roy, Singha, Burma, Rajvanshi, Das, Adhikary.

RELIGION AND BELIEF :

They are largely Hindus, with lot of their own deities and rituals. There are also Christian, Buddhist, Islam.

TRADITIONAL THINGS OF KOCH-RAJBONGSHI

a) DANCE – The folk dance of Koch Rajbongshi is known as KUSHAN NRITYA. Kushan Nritya or gaan is a rajbongshi folk drama form based on KRITTIVASI RAMAYAN. The artist narrates the story of Ramayan in Kamatapuri or Rajbongshi language through musical verse.

b) INSTRUMENTS

- Dotor : A two – stringed instruments, often used for folk music.
- Tasi : A small, single – headed drum.
- Dhak : A large, double – headed drum.
- Khol : A large, double – headed drum.
- Bena : A long – necked, plucked string instruments.

c) ORNAMENTS

- Ornaments of Ears : Onti, Makri, Guji, Kaanbali, Khirol, Paasha, etc.
- Ornaments of Waist : Got, Bat, etc.
- Ornaments of Ankles : Theng Kharu, Baagh Kharu, Paar Kharu, Char Kharu, Powpata, Mol.

d) ATTIRES -

- Patani – It is the traditional dress roughly 5 feet in length is wore by the Koch Rajbongshi women. The dresses are mainly Yellow in colour with Green Border.
- Angcha – The traditional dresses wore by the Koch Rajbongshi mens.



- Gamosa – A traditional scarf that is specifically designated or associated with Koch Rajbongshi communities.



e) FOODS –

- Sidol : A fermented fish preparation.
- Sukati : Dried fish dish.
- Horpa : A dish of snails.
- Chheka : A dish made with wild plants.
- Shukta : A dish made with dried fish.
- Kochu Shak : A dish made with Arum.
- Panta Bhat : A dish of soaked and fermented rices.

The man and womans of Koch-Rajbongshi Community is always associated to some kind of works activation like Agriculture, handloons weaving, bamboo craft.

The College Week was a resounding success fostering teamwork, creativity, and a sense of community among students, faculty, and staff.

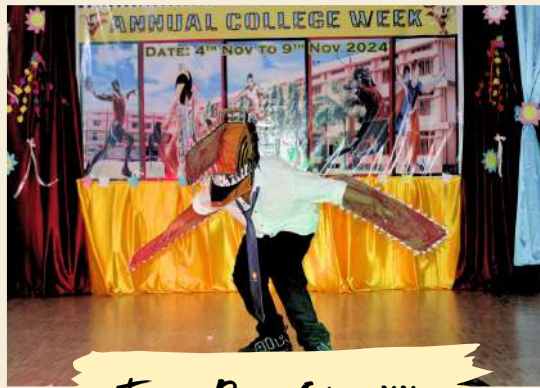

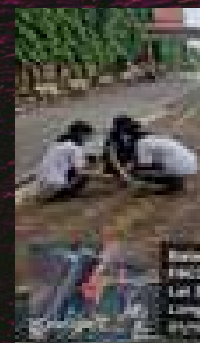
SWACHHATA HI SEVA CAMPAIGN 2024

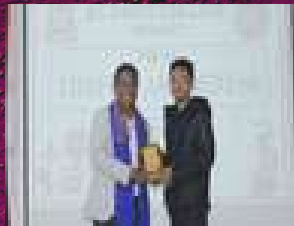

FOOD AS ETHNIC IDENTITY: EXPLORING NORTHEAST INDIA'S CULINARY HERITAGE

"Every Culture's Cuisine is a Diary of its History and Geography"

Northeast India, a mosaic of over 200 ethnic communities, is a region where geography, history, and culture converge to create a culinary tapestry as diverse as its people. Here, food transcends mere sustenance—it is a language of belonging, a marker of identity, and a bridge between the past and present. From the fermented fish of Manipur to the smoked meats of Nagaland, every dish tells a story of migration, adaptation, and resilience. In a country often synonymous with spices and curries, Northeast India's cuisine remains distinct, shaped by its isolation, indigenous practices, and the interplay of tribal traditions.



Northeast India's culinary heritage is deeply intertwined with its history. The region's rugged terrain—lush hills, dense forests, and winding rivers—has historically limited external influences, allowing indigenous communities to develop self-sustaining food systems. For centuries, tribes like the Ahom, Naga, Khasi, and Mizo relied on shifting agriculture (jhum), foraging, and fishing, cultivating crops such as rice, millet, and maize. The arrival of the British in the 19th century introduced new ingredients like potatoes and tea, but traditional practices persisted.

Fermentation, a technique born out of necessity to preserve food during monsoons, became a hallmark of the region's cuisine. Meanwhile, trade routes with Southeast Asia and Tibet brought subtle infusions of flavors, such as the use of bamboo shoots and fermented beans, creating a unique culinary identity that defies easy categorization.

At the heart of Northeast Indian Cuisine lies rice, not just as a staple but as a cultural symbol. Varieties like Assam's aromatic Joha rice or Manipur's black-rice Chak-Hao are central to daily meals and rituals. However, it is the use of fermented and organic ingredients that truly distinguishes the region's food. Axone (fermented bean) in Nagaland, Tungtap (fermented fish paste) in Meghalaya, and Khorisa & Bas Tenga (fermented bamboo shoots) in Assam and Nagaland are more than flavor enhancers—they are emblems of community identity.

Indigenous herbs like Bhunglot (Sikkim) and Phathup (Manipur) add medicinal and aromatic layers, reflecting a deep connection to the land. Unlike mainland Indian dishes, Northeastern recipes often avoid heavy spices, instead highlighting natural flavors through techniques like smoking, steaming, and boiling. This minimalist approach underscores a philosophy of harmony with nature, a value embedded in tribal cosmologies. In Northeast India, festivals are incomplete without their signature dishes, which reinforce communal bonds and cultural continuity. During Assam's Bihu, families prepare Pithas (rice cakes) and Laru (sesame sweets) as offerings to deities and ancestors.



In Nagaland, the Hornbill Festival showcases smoked pork with bamboo shoots and fiery bhut jolokia chutney, drawing visitors into the Naga way of life. Manipur's Lai Haraoba festival features Eromba (a mashed vegetable and fish dish), symbolizing the Meitei community's agrarian roots. These culinary traditions are not static; they evolve while retaining their symbolic essence. Not forgetting our Bodoland, which is home to the Bodo people, an indigenous community recognized for their distinct cultural heritage. Food plays a pivotal role in shaping their ethnic identity, reflecting their agrarian lifestyle, environmental adaptability, and historical resilience.



Cultural events like Bwisagu (Bodo New Year) and Domashi (harvest festival) showcase symbolic foods. Jou and meat dishes are ritual offerings, honoring ancestors and deities. Communal feasting during these festivals strengthens kinship and cultural continuity, embedding food into the fabric of Bodo spirituality and community life.

Food in Northeast India is more than a reflection of ethnic identity—it is an act of resistance against cultural erasure. In a world where borders and identities are increasingly fluid, the region's culinary traditions offer a grounding force, reminding communities of their shared roots and distinctiveness. From the smoky kitchens of Nagaland to the rice fields of Assam, every meal is a testament to resilience, creativity, and the enduring power of heritage. As Northeast India navigates the pressures of modernity, its food remains a potent symbol of pride, inviting the world to savor its stories, one bite at a time.

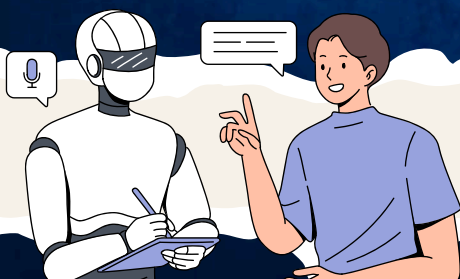
ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE IN THE FIELD OF EDUCATION AND RESEARCH

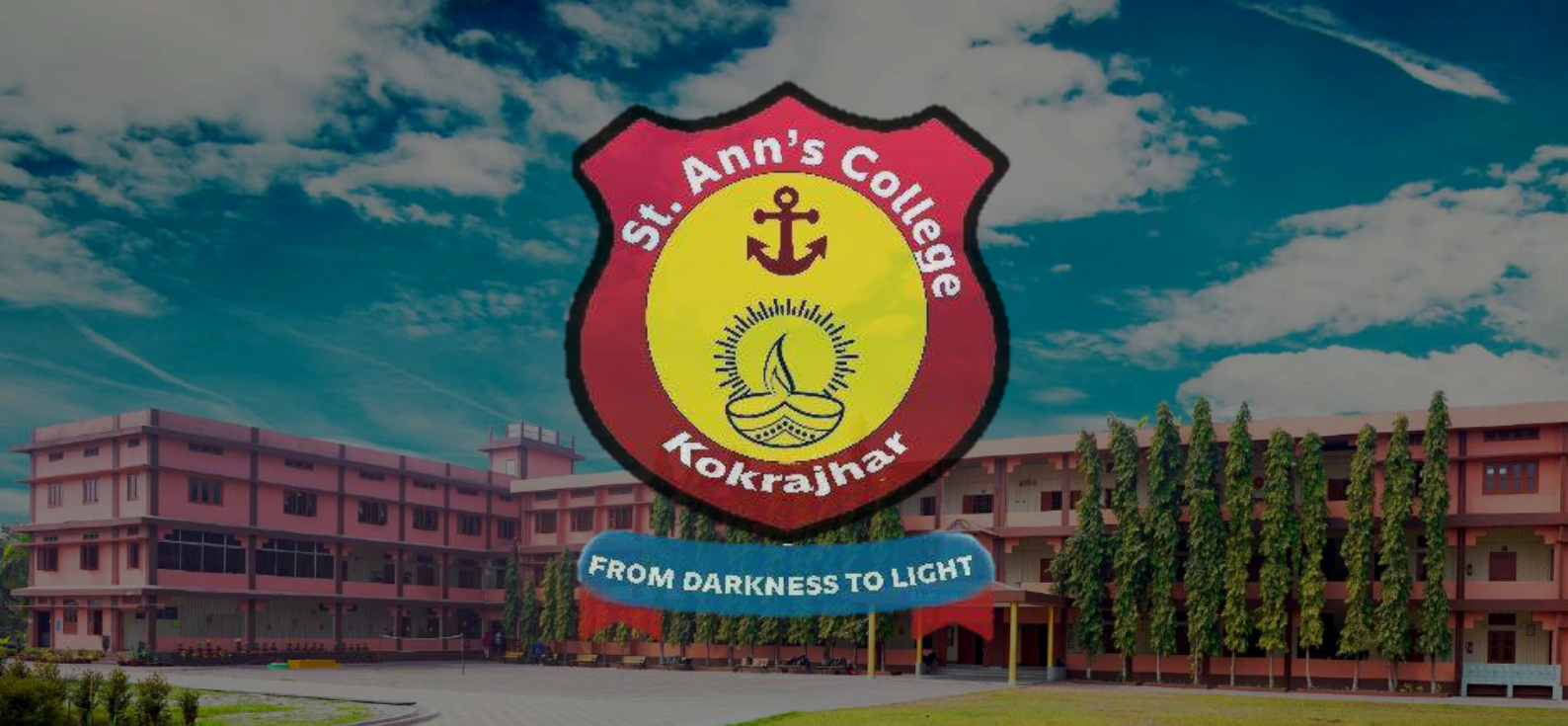
